Creating a Works Cited Page

(Adapted from Kemper, David, et. al. Write Source. Wilmington, MA: Great Source Education Group, 2006.)

- Put the title, "Works Cited," at the top of the page, in the center.
- List the sources below the title in ALPHABETICAL ORDER.
- Indent the second, third, and fourth lines of each source

HOW TO CITE BOOKS

Author (last name, first name). **Title** (underlined). **City** where the book was published: **Publisher, copyright date.**

Example with ONE author:

Salas, Laura Purdie. The Wilderness Road, 1775. Mankato: Bridgestone, 2003.

Example with TWO authors:

Bower, Bert and Jim Lobdell. History Alive. Palo Alto: Teachers' Curriculum Institute, 2001.

HOW TO CITE WEBSITES

Author (if available- last name, first name). **Web page title** (in quotation marks). **Site title** (underlined). **Date posted or updated** (if available). **Date visited** (month, day, year). **URL address** (in < >)

Example with an author:

Fabian, Sharon. "A Colonial Christmas." EdHelper. 2009. December 31, 2009.

Example without an author:

"Christopher Columbus: Explorer." Enchanted Learning. 2009. October 19, 2009. <<http://www.enchantedlearning.com/explorers/page/c/columbus.shtml>>

HOW TO CITE MAGAZINES

Author (last name, first name). **Article title** (in quotation marks). **Magazine title** (underlined) **Date** (day, month, year): **Page numbers** of the article.

Example:

Goldman, Lisa. "Going West: The Cumberland Gap." Monkeyshines on America
Apr. 1999: 26.

Works Cited Checklist

Directions: Check your Works Cited page using this checklist. If there is anything that you cannot put a checkmark by, correct it on your Works Cited page.

- The Works Cited page is on its own separate page.
- The page is titled “Works Cited.” The title is in size 18 font, bold, and centered at the top of the page.
- The sources are listed in alphabetical order according to the authors' last names. If there is no author, use the first word in the title.
- Sources are written in size 14 font, double-spaced.
- The first line of each source is NOT indented.
- The second, third, and fourth lines of each source ARE indented.
- I have used the correct format for each of my sources, based on the guidelines on the “Creating a Works Cited Page” handout.
- I have checked my work carefully for grammar, spelling, capitalization, and punctuation errors.
