Citing Sources

BOOKS

FORMAT: Author's Last Name, First Name Middle Name. *Title of Book (italicized)*. City of Publication: Publisher's Name, Year of Publication. Print.

EXAMPLE (one author): Salas, Laura Purdie. *The Wilderness Road*. Mankato: Bridgestone, 2003. Print.

EXAMPLE (two authors): Roop, Connie, and Peter Roop. *Tales of Famous Americans*. New York: Scholastic Inc., 2007. Print.

*When you have two authors, the first author's name is Last Name, First Name and the second author's name is First Name Last Name. Put the word <u>and</u> in between the two names.

ENCYCLOPEDIAS

FORMAT: Author's Last Name, First Name Middle Name. "Article Title." *Title of Encyclopedia (italicized)*. Year of Publication. Print (if book) <u>OR</u> CD-ROM (if on computer).

EXAMPLE: McGrath, Ellie. "California." World Book. 2009. CD-ROM.

WEBSITES

FORMAT: Author's Last Name, First Name Middle Name (if there's no author, skip this part). "Specific Page or Article Title." Name of Website (italicized), Year of Publication. Web. Date you Viewed the Website (Day Month (abbreviated) Year).

EXAMPLE: Fabian, Sharon. "A Colonial Christmas." *EdHelper*, 2009. Web. 25 Oct. 2011.
